

Do's and Don'ts of Tevilas Keilim

The *posuk*¹ tells us after the war with *Midyan*, utensils that were used over fire must be brought over fire, and then purified with a sprinkling of water. *Keilim* which did not come in contact with fire only need to be dipped in water. The reason for doing *tevilas keilim* on utensils (which utensils need to be *toveled* is not the subject of our discussion) is to separate ourselves from the impurity of the *goyim* and bring *kedusha* to the utensil.² The *tevila* is similar to what a *goy* does when he wants to become Jewish.³ There is a discussion in the *poskim* whether *tevilas keilim* is required *m'd'oraisa* or *m'd'rabanan*.⁴ The consensus of most *poskim* is that it is *d'oraisa*.⁵ (Except for glass)

Using a Utensil without Immersing

Many people think that one may use a utensil one time before *toveling* it in a *mikvah*. However, this is a mistake which has no basis in *halacha*, and one is required to *tovel* his utensils before using them.⁶ One who did use a utensil which was not *toveled* is still obligated to *tovel* it before using it again.⁷

Although there is no *issur* to have a non-toveled utensil in one's house,⁸ one should avoid this when possible.⁹

A Hotel using Utensils without *Toveling* Them

Many times Jewish hotels use utensils without immersing them first. One who attends such a hotel is permitted to eat from the utensils.¹⁰ Others say one should find out if the utensils were *toveled* before eating from them.¹¹

Toveling Utensils in a Men's Mikvah

Sometimes, one may wish to bring utensils with him when attending a men's *mikvah*. However, the *poskim* say that a *mikvah* for *toveling* utensils has to be *kosher* for women to *tovel* in and many times men's *mikvahos* are only *kosher* for men to *tovel* in but are not *kosher* for women. Therefore, one should only *tovel* his utensils in a *mikvah* which has been examined by a qualified *Rav* that it is *kosher* for *toveling keilim*.¹²

The *poskim* suggest that one who is going to *tovel* a utensil in a men's *mikvah* should recite the *beracha* outside the *mikvah*, enter the *mikvah*, and then immediately dip the utensil to avoid any *hefsek*.¹³ The reason for reciting the *beracha* outside is because one may not recite a *beracha* in front of improperly clad people.¹⁴ Whether or not one may *tovel* utensils in a lake or a river should be discussed with a *Rav*.¹⁵

Removing Stickers etc before the Tevilah

When being *tovel* a utensil, the water must touch the entire utensil, both inside and out.¹⁶ Before *toveling* a utensil one should remove all stickers, dirt, rust, etc, from the *keli* because leaving them on is a *chatzitzah* which makes the *tevila* invalid.¹⁷ One is not

required to remove a *chatzitzah* which he is not *makpid* on.¹⁸ However, this is only if the sticker, etc. does not cover the whole utensil. If the *chatzitzah* covers most of the utensil it is still considered a *chatzitzah* even if one is not *makpid* on it.¹⁹ A *chatzitzah* which one is *makpid* on sometimes but was not *makpid* on at the time of the *tevila* is still considered a *chatzitzah*.²⁰

A sticker which is not usually removed from the utensil is not a *chatzitzah*.²¹ For example, some say that a sticker with the word "crystal" does not have to be removed because it is *chashuv* to keep it on the utensil.²² If one scratched and tried to take off the *chatzitzah* and some of it still stayed on, one may nonetheless *tovel* the utensil.²³ Glue can normally be removed with acetone, nail polish remover, or WD 40. One who *toveled* a utensil with a *chatzitzah* on which he is *makpid* has to repeat the *tevila*.²⁴ One who only realized that there was a *chatzitzah* after taking his mind off the *tevilah* has to recite another *beracha* before *toveling* the *keli* a second time.²⁵

The Beracha

The *beracha* recited is *boruch ata... al tevilas keilim* if one is immersing many *keilim*, or *al tevilas keli* if one is only immersing one *keli.*²⁶ Some say that even one who is immersing one *keli* still says *al tevilas keilim*,²⁷ although the *minhag* is not in accordance with this opinion.²⁸ One who did recite the *beracha* of *al tevilas keli* when *toveling* many *keilim* was

yotzei b'dieved.²⁹ If one recited the *beracha* of *borcuch ata....* and ended off *al keli mateches* (metal) he was *yotzei b'dieved.*³⁰ A pot with a cover is considered one utensil, and the *beracha* is *al tevilas keli.*³¹

One should recite the *beracha* immediately prior to dipping the utensil into the water.³² If one did not recite the *beracha* before dipping the utensil in the water it is unclear if he should recite the *beracha* afterwards.³³ There is a discussion in the *poskim* if one who is doubtful if he recited a *beracha* should still recite it.³⁴ One who is being *tovel* more than one utensil should be careful not to talk between the first utensil and the second.³⁵ One who is *toveling keilim* and new *keilim* are brought to be *toveled* which he did not intend to *tovel* at the time he recited the *beracha*, would need to recite a new *beracha* before *toveling* these utensils.³⁶ One may recite the *beracha* while sitting or standing.³⁷

How to Tovel

The entire utensil must be completely under water at one time.³⁸ One should not hold onto the utensil too tightly because doing so may constitute a *chatzitzah*, since his grasp is preventing the water from touching the part of the utensil that is being held.³⁹ One must make sure that no air gets trapped in the utensil during *tevila*.⁴⁰ The easiest way to *tovel* glasses etc. is to stand them right side up once they are under the water.⁴¹ One can

place many utensils in a basket and place the basket in the water.⁴² However, one must be careful that the utensils are not on top of each other, because then the water will not touch each utensil properly.⁴³ One can tie a rope to a utensil and dip the utensil in the water.⁴⁴ When doing the *tevilah* by hand one should place the utensil in his right hand.⁴⁵ One who is afraid he will drop the utensil if it is not held tightly during the *tevila* should place some water on his hand and then hold the utensil.⁴⁶ One is allowed to *tovel* utensils both by day and by night.⁴⁷ Some say one should have in mind when dipping the utensil that it should become pure.⁴⁸

How Many Times

One does not have to *tovel* a utensil more than once.⁴⁹ Some have the custom to *tovel* the utensil three times.⁵⁰

Who May Tovel

All people are believed to say that they were *tovel* a utensil in a *mikvah* in the proper way. However, a *goy* and young child (under *bar-mitzvah*) are only believed if a adult was standing over them making sure that the *tevilla* was done properly.⁵¹ Nonetheless, *I'chatchilah* a *goy* should not be *tovel keilim*.⁵² The custom is that a woman is believed on

tevilas keilim.⁵³ If an adult is watching a child do the tevilla the child may recite a beracha on the tevila.⁵⁴ Some say that a young child below (bar-mitzvah) who toveled glass utensils is believed to say he was tovel them and the tevila is good even without adult supervision.⁵⁵

Giving a Utensil as a Present

One who wants to give a present to someone should not *tovel* it first.⁵⁶ For example, one who gives a dish with *m'shloach manos* should put a sticker on the dish saying it was not *toveled*.
